

ABOUT THE CLUB

The Club is on land originally owned by H.P. (Percy) Brazier on which there were tennis courts. Percy was a major benefactor to the town of Worthing. As well as bowls, he was also an accomplished sportsman in six different sports.

The tennis courts were converted into two magnificent "Cumberland Turf" greens in 1947. These were open for play on 1st May 1948 but were officially opened on 4th May 1949 when a match was played against a rink from each of six Associations. They were the EBA, Sussex County B.A., Dennyside B.A., Banks B.A., London and Southern Counties B.A. and Worthing Town Council.

Percy represented Sussex on many occasions and played for England on no less than twenty occasions. The Club facilities subsequently passed to the Members with Percy Brazier as its President.

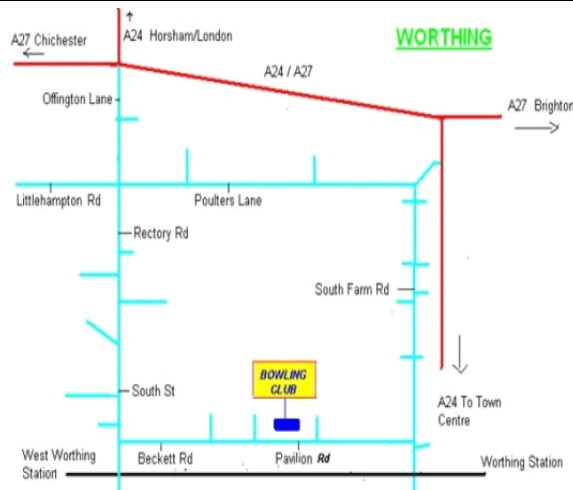
Three indoor rinks were built in 1962, enabling the Members to bowl all the year round. Unfortunately, these were burnt down in 1964 and were re-opened after rebuilding in 1966. In 1997, with the aid of Lottery funding, an additional three rinks were built on a spare plot of land to the west of the outdoor greens. At the same time, alterations were made to accommodate wheelchair access.

Air conditioning and a high standard of lighting were installed on all indoor rinks during the summer of 2005.

A new dining room was added in the winter of 2008 that now houses the clubs trophy cabinet.

BOWLING

This Club offers all year round bowling to all ages above the age of ten and for all abilities (see coaching below). Whether you prefer to play socially and/or competitively is your choice. If you wish to play competitively there are Club Championships and internal leagues plus entries to County and National Championships. We also play some 250 Men's/Ladies' Mixed matches each year, comprising both league, cup and friendly matches.

COACHING

For those people who are new to bowling, coaching is available. Inexperienced bowlers join the Club as Associate Members

for which a fee is paid (currently £25). Five two hour coaching sessions are arranged, at the conclusion of which the Associate Member is then offered Full Membership. If the Member wishes to join the Club, the fee is deducted from the cost of the first year's Membership. During the period of Associate Membership the Member has full use of the Club, bar, catering and social facilities.

FACILITIES

The Club has two outdoor greens, each comprising six rinks, and a further six rinks indoors. Catering facilities are available with refreshments at reasonable prices. Tea, cream teas or dinner are served in conjunction with all matches. Lunches are available each day except Monday. There is also a bar which is open daily from 11.00 a.m. until 2.00 p.m. and from 5.00 p.m. until 10.15 p.m., apart from Sunday when opening hours are from midday until 2.00 p.m. and from 5.30 p.m. until 8.00 p.m.



SOCIAL

We offer a range of social events. These include cribbage evenings, barbecues, dinner dances, day trips to France, trips to places of interest – e.g. The London Eye, the Houses of Parliament, theatres etc. Currently, bowls tours are arranged annually.

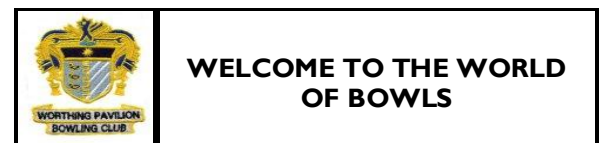

ABOUT LAWN BOWLS PLAYING AREA:

A bowling green is normally square. It is surrounded by a shallow ditch.

The perimeter of the ditch is surrounded by a bank. The green is normally divided into six "rinks" allowing six games to take place concurrently. We have two bowling greens allowing twelve games to take place concurrently.

Surface wear is spread by moving the rink settings laterally and by changing direction of play during the day playing either north-south or east-west. As indicated on the board at the front of the greens
