

Competition Information (also posted on the Mens notice boards)

Mens Singles Championship – 4 woods each and first to 21 shots. There is no handicap. The challenger (first drawn player) must arrange the game and the marker before the end fixed date.

Mens Handicap Singles – 4 woods each and first to 21 shots. There is a handicap in this competition and must be calculated and added prior to the start of the game. The challenger (first drawn player) must arrange the game and the marker before the end fixed date.

Mens Two Wood Singles – 2 woods and 21 ends. There is no handicap. If it is tied score at 21 ends then an extra end is played.

Mens 100 Up – First player to get to 100 points. The nearest 4 woods score points. The 1st wood scores 4 points, 2nd wood score 3 points, 3rd wood scores 2 points, 4th woods scores 1 point. If tied wood then no points scored. 1st wood has possession of mat on next end. If on one end both players reach 100 points the player scoring 1st wood/shot wood is the winner. There is no handicap. The challenger (first drawn player) must arrange the game and the marker before the end fixed date.

Mens Silver Jack – 4 woods each and first to 21 shots.. This is for any player that hasn't won a singles trophy. The challenger (first drawn player) must arrange the game and the marker before the end fixed date.

Mens Young at Heart – 4 woods each and first to 21 shots. This is for any player aged 70 and over. The challenger (first drawn player) must arrange the game and the marker before the end fixed date.

Mens Pairs Championship – 4 woods each and 21 ends. There is no handicap. If it is a tied score at 21 ends then an extra end is played. The challenger (first drawn pair) must arrange the game and before the end fixed date.

Mens Handicap Drawn Pairs – 4 woods each and 21 ends. There is a handicap in this competition and must be calculated and added prior to the

start of the game. If it is a tied score at 21 ends then an extra end is played. The challenger (first drawn pair) must arrange the game and before the end fixed date.

Mens Triples Championship - 3 woods each and 18 ends. There is no handicap. If it is a tied score at 18 ends then an extra end is played. The challenger (first drawn triple) must arrange the game and before the end fixed date.

Mixed Pairs Championship - 4 woods each and 21 ends. There is no handicap. If it is a tied score at 21 ends then an extra end is played. The challenger (first drawn pair) must arrange the game and before the end fixed date.

Open Handicap Australian Pairs - 4 woods each and 18 ends. There is a handicap in this competition and must be calculated and added prior to the start of the game. If it is a tied score at 18 ends then an extra end is played. The challenger (first drawn pair) must arrange the game and before the end fixed date.

All players and markers should check the rules of the competition before play commences.

Any competition not played to correct rules will be declared null & void, and will have to be re-played as soon as possible to avoid delays for next round.

Walkovers should only be given where it is unavoidable due to illness etc. The Competition Secretary should be informed, and a signed scorecard completed.
